## A Catholic Wedding Chapel

### **GUIDELINES FOR PHOTOGRAPHERS AND VIDEOGRAPHERS**

St. John Chapel, a holy and sacred place, welcomes you. We ask that all of your work reflect the sacredness of the marriage ceremony and St. John Chapel. These guidelines are designed to assist you in this endeavor.

Please share this information with your vendors. We thank you for your cooperation.

1. No equipment is to be placed near or pictures taken from the:
  - a. Sanctuary
  - b. Eucharistic Chapel
  - c. Musician area (\*See Chart)
2. All equipment is to be placed so as not obstruct the view of the congregation.
3. Photographers - Except during the **PROCESSIONAL AND RECESSIONAL** your position must be **stationary and unobtrusive**. Do not move around during the ceremony. Photographers will remain behind the entrance to the second bank of pews.
4. You may bring equipment into the chapel 30 minutes prior to the ceremony. **NO STORAGE CASES OR EXTRA EQUIPMENT ARE ALLOWED IN THE AISLES. THESE ITEMS MAY BE STORED IN THE LAST PEW AT THE BACK OF THE CHAPEL.**
5. All pictures will be within the bounds of decorum as befitting this sacred space. The photographers, videographers and wedding party will remain standing at all times. Sitting or reclining on the floor of the chapel is not permitted.
6. There is a quarter-inch high impedance out-put at the rear of the chapel for your convenience.
7. The Waterfall Garden and the West Gazebo, on either side of the chapel, may be used for pictures. We ask that you keep the noise level to a minimum as other weddings may be in progress.
8. Balcony photos must be arranged prior to the day of the wedding. Photography is **not** permitted from the bridal suite or balcony during a ceremony.
